Monday	Listening: Practice CAE listening exam skills - multiple choice questions and a discussion of exam strategies. Topic: "A cultural education"	Vocabulary: Phrases to describe senses and feelings, different ways to discuss what you see and hear "catch a glimpse of, caught my eye, ..."	Reading & Vocabulary: Dealing with texts in the Cambridge exams, class complete a reading activity together and discuss the text.	Grammar: Using inversion in English to emphasise a point. Students try some speaking practice tasks in small groups.
Tuesday	Listening: Students study vocabulary that will appear in the listening exam and try a practice exam from CAE part 2.	Speaking & Vocabulary: Useful phrases connected with reading and writing such as "avid reader, creative writing", and speaking practice in groups.	Speaking: Collaborative speaking task, students look at pictures and describe the situations they see and the problems associated with being in those situations.	Writing: Students analyse the language and structure of proposals, go through the language, and attempt to write a proposal for an arts magazine in the class.
Wednesday	Reading: Skills for freading, dealing with multiple choice questions: useful techniques to maximise your score and to complete the text efficiently.	Vocabulary: Describing personality, highlight positive and negative characteristics and applying them to people we know.	Grammar: Talking about the future: plans, predictions, promises, and a look at important future tenses such as future continuous and future perfect.	Listening: Part 4, multiple choice. Students look at how the questions are set out, discuss tactics for dealing with this section and try some practise tasks.
Thursday	Grammar & Speaking: Useful collocations to use in the exam and in real-life such as: "take into account, make sense of, play a part in..." Students will also look at dictionary skills.	Writing: Part 2 - an informal letter. Analysing the style and language used, looking at examples letters, then students attempt one of their own.	Reading: Part 3 - multiple matching - "Born to be wild" - students read a text and try out exam techniques to successfully complete the task whilst being guided by the teacher.	Speaking: Part 2 - Describe a photo - vocabulary and grammatical phrases useful for describing a photo, for example: present continuous, plus a look at language to compare and contrast two situations: whereas, while, meanwhile,...
Friday	Exam practice: Practise the reading sections of the exam and receive feedback.	Exam practice: Practise the listening sections of the exam and receive feedback.	Exam practice: Practise the speaking sections of the exam and receive feedback.	Review: Students are given feedback on exam performance, and are given advice on how to improve. Vocabulary and grammar from the week are also reviewed.
